

# Jacks Point to Frankton Trail

## Project Update

What	Construction of a pedestrian & cycle trail between Jacks Point and Frankton
When	2026 - 2027
Where	Jacks Point, Hanley Farm, Woolbrae, Park Ridge, Frankton

### What's happening?

Queenstown Trails is constructing an off-road walking and cycling trail that will connect Jacks Point to Frankton. This has been enabled with the support of land owners, developers, QLDC, NZTA and the southern corridor community.

### Where will the trail go?

The Jacks Point to Frankton Trail starts at Lake Tewa (the end of the existing Jacks Point Lakeside Trail), heading north through Hanley Farm, Woolbrae and Park Ridge subdivisions, following the base of Peninsula Hill before crossing Peninsula Road to rejoin the wider Queenstown Trail network at Kawarau Falls.



### General Information

#### Funding


Thanks to generous grants from Central Lakes Trust, Darby Partners and Park Ridge, as well as overwhelming community support and donations, the Jacks Point to Frankton Trail project is close to reaching its fundraising target.

#### Next Steps

Detailed design is now complete, and pending a road safety audit signoff, the project can be tendered for construction by mid-winter, with work expected to commence later in 2026.

#### Completion

Once the contract has been awarded we'll have a better estimate on completion timeframes, but we're hoping the trail will be operational sometime during the summer of 2026-27.
